

DISCIPLESHIP: THE WORD OF GOD

More important than all our other needs and wants, more important even than physical life itself, is God's word to man" ...so David Watson introduces this aspect of discipleship. "Christianity is essentially a revealed religion. It is not man searching in the dark for God. It is God revealing himself to man in a way so personal that it demands a response". John wrote that we worship in Spirit and Truth (4:24) and that is the essence of God's revelation of himself to us. We read the Bible, inspired by the Holy Spirit, to reveal eternal truths and specific instruction just for us and our situation. A disciple is an apprentice, seeking to be like the teacher, and He has written a manual for us to follow! God's word comes to us through the words of the bible, through historic teaching and tradition such as the creeds and through fresh revelation in prophetic words and words of knowledge through the Holy Spirit. Many things can hinder us hearing God's word for us; refusing to listen to challenges from God; being too busy and not making time and space to listen; reading with worldly glasses on; just reading the bible as a story rather than a revelation of God; being too literal and cherry picking texts; or being too analytical.

At a recent conference the speaker was talking about looking at ourselves, church and community from God's perspective. My eyes were drawn to the metaphor of the spotlight above shining light on the stage. ...just like our parish magazine which carries the scripture Psalm 119:8 *"Your word is a lamp to my feet, and a light to my path"*

Will we seek the light of his Word revealed to us at St Peter's; for us, our church and community?

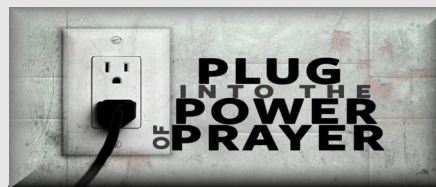
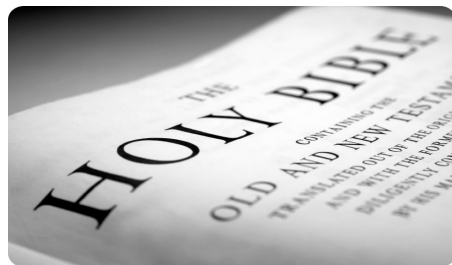
